We are excited to announce that each week leading up to the 76th Annual Conference in Spokane, WA, we will be highlighting one of our esteemed CE (Continuing Education) speakers! This week, we're thrilled to shine the spotlight on **Jason Hunt**, who will be sharing his expertise on **Pregnancy**, **Addiction**, and **Stigma**.

Dr. Jason M. Hunt, MD, currently practices addiction medicine at Recovery Keys in Ponte Vedra, FL. He is a former assistant professor with the University of Florida College of Medicine's Department of Psychiatry/Division of Addiction Medicine. Dr. Hunt has extensive expertise in addiction medicine, with a career spanning clinical care, academic leadership, and national advocacy.

A graduate of the University of Illinois College of Medicine, Dr. Hunt completed his OB-GYN residency at the University of Louisville and an Addiction Medicine Fellowship at the University of Florida. He is a nationally certified Advanced Alcohol and Drug Counselor (AADC) and has served as a Board Member of the

Alabama Alcohol and Drug Abuse Association (AADAA).

Dr. Hunt is widely recognized for his work in treating substance use and cooccurring disorders, with a particular focus on opioid use disorder during pregnancy. He has presented extensively at state and national conferences and currently serves as a Peer Prescriber Mentor for FADAA and the Florida Department of Children and Families. He also consults with the Opioid Response Network (ORN) and is a co-author of *Understanding Addiction: Know Science, No Stigma*, a book that reached #7 on Amazon's Drug Dependency & Recovery list.

- Discuss how stigma impacts patients and the shame associated with it that deters them from seeking treatment.
